HISTORY OF CHINESE NEW YEAR

Chinese New Year is also known as the Spring Festival or the Lunar New Year. The festival celebrates the beginning of a new year on the traditional lunisolar Chinese calendar.

Back in the days, China and other Asian countries within Sino-sphere heavily relied on agriculture. Therefore, people from those countries discovered and followed the lunisolar calendar to decide when to plant and harvest to maximise yield.

They divide a year into twenty-four solar terms, and 'Lichun' is the first day of the spring term. Hence it is the date of the Chinese New Year. Nevertheless, the CNY festival is also a celebration of marking the end of the winter term and the beginning of the spring season. Traditionally activities would usually start from Chinese New Year's Eve until the 7th day of the Chinese New Year.

Having said that, as human society improves, nowadays, people no longer heavily rely on the lunisolar calendar for agriculture and the Chinese New Year has been transformed into a festival of family "Reunion and Bringing Happiness" and joy to the people around you.

Throughout the decades, more Chinese people migrated to different parts of the world and established their communities overseas (e.g., Chinatown and Chinese

> organisations). The CNY has become a well-known festival across the globe. Big cities like New York, London, Sydney, Paris etc. will have celebrations every year, including performances like the Lion and Dragon Parades and hanging Chinese Lanterns across the streets.
